

Wymore City Council Regular Meeting April 18, 2018

The Wymore City Council met in open and public session on April 18, 2018, in the Council Chambers. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Pike. Present were Mayor Pike, Councilpersons Sue Sapp, Keith Ottersberg, Curt Oblinger, Max Allen and City Attorney Andy Carothers. Notice of the meeting was in advance by posting in three places: Wymore Post Office, Arbor State Pharmacy and The City Office. Notice was given to the Mayor and Council and their acknowledgement of receipt is attached. All other proceedings shown were taken while the meeting was open to the public.

Motion by Max, second by Keith, to approve the minutes from the regular meeting held on April 4, 2018. Carried 4-0

Motion by Sue, second by Max, to approve claims and payroll. Carried 4-0


Public Comment: Andy handed the mayor and Council an inner-local agreement between Wymore EMS and the City of Beatrice. This agreement is for them to look over and bring back their recommendations to the next meeting. Michelle and Jason Ahola are interested in starting a business in Wymore and are looking for a building if anyone knows of one. They were present to ask the Mayor and Council if they should know of any to please let them know. Jim Decker informed the Mayor and Council that the Fire Department had been approached to do a controlled burn on a house on south 11th street. After inspecting the area it was determined the house was too close to the neighbor's house and so the controlled burn was denied. Mark Meints commented that he gave Andy the agreement from the Beatrice Humane Society and Andy will look it over and bring back to the May 2nd meeting. Mark also informed the Mayor and Council that there was an application received for the Chief's position. Mark has placed this item on the May 2nd agenda. Mark brought forth discussion concerning the heating and air conditioning at the community center. The park board would like to move forth on stage three of the community center renovation and come back to phase two once phase three is finished. This renovation is in the discussion stage only at this time.

Gloria Henderson was present and informed the Mayor and Council that the Kiwanis had received a grant for putting three cameras up at McCandless Park. The park board voted and approved the cameras being put up. The school house at McCandless park will house the receiver and the police department will have access to look at the film should there be an issue at the park. The Wymore/Blue Springs Area Fund has received a bid from Crouch Recreation for the second phase in installing new playground equipment. The Wymore/Blue Springs Area Fund is looking onto grants to help pay for this. Gloria also discussed the new concession stand/bathrooms/storage facility that has been proposed for at McCandless Park. The park board voted and passed having the City apply for a Thomas Foundation Grant to help with expenses. Gloria informed the Mayor and Council that the pool will be opening on May 26th and will be open from noon until eight pm daily weather permitting.

Liz Parde approached Mayor Pike and was inquiring about the zoning status of the property she purchased on north 3rd street. Andy will give her a call and visit with her about this.

Sue made a motion to adjourn at 7:58
